Meet the women of the U.S. Army Signal Corps. Recruited to serve in France as bilingual telephone operators during WWI, they swore Army oaths, wore uniforms, held rank, and were subject to military justice. By war's end, they had earned the praise of General Pershing for their service—but their military service wasn't recognized by the U.S. government until 1977. Learn their story told through interviews through rare archival footage and photos.
