



Dear Friends,

For 65 years, the War Memorial Center's mission has been to Honor the Dead — Serve the Living. As a memorial built to honor the lives lost in World War II, we will always honor the dead. But in 2021, we focused our work on really looking at the second part of that mission. What does it mean to Serve the Living?

We believe the War Memorial Center is an oasis for veterans in need of support. To that end, we joined with the Medical College of Wisconsin as the primary community partner in a two-year program looking at the effect of mass communication on preventing veteran suicide. Through this program, WMC designed and launched a statewide mass media and social media public health messaging campaign designed to increase help-seeking behavior and decrease the incidence of firearm suicides among Wisconsin veterans.

We also joined forces with the Southeastern Wisconsin Mental Health Taskforce as the lead organization for the BeThereWis.com public awareness campaign. We host quarterly veteran suicide prevention training programs and cosponsored, along with Verlo, a program focusing on the impact of sleep on mental health.

While the full effects of the Covid-19 pandemic may not be known for several years, the immediate impact on our finances is clear with earned revenue losses of \$430,000 in 2020 and \$280,000 in 2021. Community support is critical to enable our programs to be provided free of charge to veterans in partnership with local veteran organizations. Other 2021 milestones include:

- Celebrating and supporting the veterans who served our nation over the past 30 years since Desert Storm, while also marking the 20th anniversary of the attacks on September 11, 2001, through our **Operation 30:20 campaign**.
- Honoring the dead by educating the living through educational programs about the experiences of the men
 and women who bravely serve our country and their sacrifices for our freedom.
- Providing hope, inspiration, and critical insight on the challenges we face today through sharing inspirational stories of sacrifice and courage of local veterans through our unique Veterans Story Project.

We serve as the distinctive voice for veterans, honoring their service and sacrifice and building partnerships throughout the community to meet the needs of veterans and their families. As a community, we need the War Memorial Center to continue to serve our veterans and to preserve the memory of those who made the ultimate sacrifice to help us keep in mind the true cost of freedom.


