Dear Friends,

We took President Lincoln's quote to heart in 2022 and moved the War Memorial Center in an exciting new direction. The launch of Operation Advance set us on a path toward permanent exhibits for the first time in our history. We are pleased to report the success of phase one allowed us to open the Wisconsin Medal of Honor exhibit in Honor Gallery in August of 2022.

The exhibit transforms previously unused space in a corridor connecting the War Memorial Center to the Milwaukee Art Museum. This reimagined space is designed to honor our heroes, educate with history, and support the healing process by sharing the timeless stories and experiences of veterans.

Wisconsin's Medal of Honor exhibit tells the stories of the 64 Wisconsin recipients since the Civil War who have been awarded our nation's highest military decoration. They were farmers, shopkeepers, factory workers, sons and brothers. But when called to serve our country, they each did something extraordinary. It is our privilege to share their stories in hopes that they will inspire us all to reach our potential and create a better future for our state, our country and our world.

We are moving into phase two of Operation Advance to fund future interactive exhibits. These include one focused on POW/MIA (Prisoner of War/Missing in Action) and one centered on a Situation Room—a leadership lab where students and adult learners explore the characteristics of military exemplars throughout history.

### **Something for Everyone**

The War Memorial Center continues to reintroduce itself to the community through a host of engaging events that have brought thousands of visitors to our beautiful lakefront home. From the awe-inspiring Memorial Day weekend **Field of Flags** to the return of the **Celebration of Freedom** July 3rd fireworks show after a two-year absence to the expansion of our summer beer garden, there is truly something for everyone at the War Memorial Center.

Thank you for helping us fulfill the mission that has guided us for 66 years: Honor the Dead by Serving the Living.

### Michael W. Grebe, Chairman, Trustee since 2016

Michael Grebe is an American philanthropist, lawyer, and businessman. He was Chairman/CEO of the law firm Foley & Lardner and then served as President/CEO of the Bradley Foundation. She began her military career in high school and went on to be a commissioned officer in the U.S. Army and Army Reserves.

Mike Koszuta served 30 years in the U.S. Army retiring as a Command Sergeant Major. Mike's years of service to our country and community started as a law enforcement officer for Waukesha and Milwaukee Police Departments. He then enlisted with the U.S. Coast Guard, eventually transferring to the U.S Army. He served in the Middle East during Operation Desert Storm. **WMC Motivation:** The people I served with during peace and war made me a better soldier, husband, and father. My mission is to tell their stories.



### Co Nguyen, Trustee since 2021

Co Nguyen is a first-generation Vietnamese American who immigrated to the United States with his parents and younger brother after the fall of Saigon, which he witnessed from a ship as his family escaped. Co was the fourth Vietnamese American ever selected for admission to the United States Military Academy at West Point. Co was Airborne, Air Assault and Ranger qualified. As a battery executive officer, Co deployed with his unit to Panama in support of operation Just Cause. As a detachment commander, Co led his detachment in joint task force deployments from Alaska to Mexico. Co is currently the head of quality for Rockwell Automation. Co and his family have lived and worked in Brazil, Hong Kong/China, and Singapore.



### Ray Pasbrig, Trustee since 2022

Ray Pasbrig is a Vietnam veteran with decades of service to veteran organizations. Ray enlisted in the U.S. Marines under the "buddy system" in 1968. That meant he was guaranteed boot camp as a group with his three high school friends. He served in Vietnam from 1969-1970. As a veteran, Ray worked his way up through numerous leadership positions with the American Legion, Legion Riders and Wisconsin Forty & Eight.



### John Weishan, Jr., Trustee since 2013

John Weishan, Jr. is one of the longest serving members of the WMC Board. He is a U.S. Marine Corps veteran and deployed to Japan twice and the Philippine Islands for training exercises. John served on the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors for the 16th District from 2000 to 2022.



### Christine Westrich, Trustee since 2019

Christine Westrich graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy and served 11 years as a Marine back-seater in the F/A-18D Hornet with additional tours at the White House Military Office and within the Intelligence Community. She is now a professional artist working with hand embroidery, oil paint, and the occasional digital design.
